**CHRIS TRAPPER OF THE PUSH STARS RELEASES SECOND SOLO CD
'GONE AGAIN'.**

October 04, 2005 (BOSTON,MA) Boston, MA based, pop-rock frontman Chris Trapper of The Push Stars releases second independent solo CD 'Gone Again' on Tuesday, October 11, 2005. His most ambitious solo work to date, the singer and songwriter impresses with new collection of songs recorded with the celebrated Wolverine Jazz Band.

Singer and songwriter Chris Trapper of The Push Stars is back with a new CD. The latest disc boasts an impressive and eclectic collection of 11 new, original tunes. 'Gone Again' combines Chris' vocal stylings with a New Orleans inspired jazz backdrop provided by Boston's own Wolverine Jazz Band. Chris was honored when the band expressed an interest in his tunes and immediately set aside time to rehearse and record. Chris sees 'Gone Again' as a way to introduce these wise and experienced jazz musicians to today's younger pop music buyers.

For many years, throughout Boston and southern New England, the Wolverine Jazz Band has been entertaining devotees of traditional and Dixieland jazz. Their musical contribution to Chris Trapper's 'Gone Again' is remarkable and instantly memorable. The CD was recorded 'live' without computer technology and is infinitely better for it. Chris happily asserts "the music on 'Gone Again' breathes, and has a pulse."

Critics scramble for the superlatives when describing Chris' musicianship and over the years he has been honored with numerous Boston Music Awards and a Platinum Record for his songs on the Great Big Sea release 'Sea of No Cares'. Chris is a founding member and the lead singer for nationally acclaimed pop-rock band The Push Stars. The New York Times calls the band 'classic pop perfection.' When on hiatus from The Push Stars, Chris writes, records and tours in support of his solo efforts. Additionally, Chris Trapper tunes can be found on major motion picture and network TV soundtracks including There's Something About Mary, Say It Isn't So, ER, and Malcolm In The Middle.

Chris' musical expression puts him immediately into a group of recording artists that are known for their unique vocal stylings and progressive song interpretation. Defying standard categorization, 'Gone Again' sees Chris blending the best of pop song sensibilities with intricate and deeply nuanced jazz musicianship, forging perhaps a new pop-culture category where tradition meets modern-day media. What holds the entire work together is the tone and quality of Chris' expertly crafted pop songwriting.

Produced by Brad Young (Dow Brain, Underground Productions). Musicians include John Clark (clarinet, saxophone), Jeff Hughes (cornet, trumpet), Tom Boates (trombone), Ross Petot (piano), Jimmy Mazzy (banjo). The Loft at XM Satellite Radio has already add the track 'Jukebox Lights' to their New Music Magazine radio hour.

Chris will be touring this Fall in support of the release. Confirmed performances include stops in Boston, Chicago, St. Paul, Cleveland, New York City and more. 'Gone Again' is available for sale on the official artist website, at all shows or by visiting CDBaby.com or Amazon.com.
